The three day event concludes with Illinois PHCC Board of Directors and Auxiliary Board meetings on Saturday, March 21st. 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# REVISIONS TO THE ILLINOIS PLUMBERS LICENSING CODE

Revisions to the Illinois Plumbers Licensing Code (750 Rules) became effective on September 23, 2014. Included in the changes are mandates for all plumbing inspectors to be certified, as well as fee increases.

Plumbing inspectors employed by governmental units have until March 30, 2015 to take and pass the IDPH Certified Inspectors exam. Plumbing inspectors not directly employed by the municipality, but who are contracted to conduct inspections, must currently have the certification in order to continue to perform plumbing inspections. IDPH will schedule examinations when it has sufficient applicants, and a date and location will be determined at that time. Anyone wishing to take the exam can obtain the application by downloading it from the Department's website at www.idph.state.il.us/envhealth/plumbing.htm. The completed application is to be submitted to the Illinois Department of Public Health, 535 West Jefferson Street, 3rd Floor, Springfield, Illinois 62761.

The Plumbers' and Apprentice Plumbers' exam and licensure fees have increased as follows:

Plumber's License Examination Fee - \$175.

Plumber's License Exam Fee for applicant licensed in another state - \$225.

Plumber's License Re-Exam Fee - \$175.

Plumber's License Fee (Initial or Renewal) - **\$150**.

Apprentice Plumber's License Fee (Initial or Renewal) - **\$100**.

Late Fee or Reinstatement Fee for any license renewal - \$100

Restoration of a Plumber's Expired License Fee - \$175.

Duplicate License Fee - \$50.

Restoration from a Retired License over 5 years - \$175.

Certified Plumbing Inspector's Examination Fee - \$175.

Certified Plumbing Inspector's Late Fee - **\$100**.

Chicago Licensed Certified Plumbing Inspector - **\$150**.

The fee for a dishonored, negotiable instrument including, but not limited to, returned checks or insufficient payment shall be \$100.

## **Revisions to the Illinois Plumbing Contractor Registration Code**

Revisions to the Illinois Plumbing Contractor Registration Code (Adm. Code 894) became effective on November 12, 2014. Included in the changes are general language cleanups, and fee increases as follows:

Annual registration fee \$150.

The reinstatement fee was increased to \$100.

The fee for a dishonored negotiable instrument including, but not limited to, returned checks or insufficient payment shall be \$200.


The Auxiliary will again be selling plumbing themed items at the Expo. Stop by our booth and see what the Auxiliary has to offer.

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## Revisions to the Illinois LAWN IRRIGATION CONTRACTOR & Lawn Sprinkler System REGISTRATION CODE

Revisions to the Lawn Irrigation Contractor and Lawn Sprinkler Registration Code (Adm. Code 892) became effective on November 12, 2014. There were changes in definitions, registration requirements, a section added for Providers of Design and Installation Courses, and increases in fees.

The following definitions were revised and now read:

"Irrigation employee" means a person, other than a licensed plumber or licensed apprentice plumber, who is employed by a registered irrigation contractor or a licensed plumber, and who designs, repairs, alters, maintains, or installs lawn sprinkler systems that are subject to Section 2.5 of the Law.

"Lawn sprinkler system" means any underground irrigation system of lawn, shrubbery and other vegetation from any potable water sources; and from any water sources, whether or not potable. "Lawn sprinkler system" includes without limitation the water supply piping, valves, control systems, low voltage wiring, and sprinkler heads or other irrigation outlets, and moisture or rainfall sensing equipment, but does not include the backflow prevention device or final connection of the lawn sprinkler system to the backflow

device. "Lawn sprinkler system" does not include an irrigation system used primarily for agricultural purposes. (Section 2 of the Law) "Lawn sprinkler system" does not include extension, relocation, or modification of up to 200 linear yards of an existing lawn sprinkler system installed at a golf course prior to January 26, 2000. (Section 2.6 of the Law.)

#### **Irrigation Contractor Registration Requirements:**

Registration forms for contractors and employees shall be submitted on forms available from the Department's website (http://www.idph. state.il.us/envhealth/plumbing.htm).

Contractor applicants must provide a certificate of insurance and workers' compensation insurance, as well as an indemnification bond or letter of credit.

Irrigation contractors shall provide, on forms provided by the Department, the following:

- A) Proof that at least one irrigation employee has completed and passed an approved class in the design and installation of lawn sprinkler systems;
- B) The names of employees who have successfully completed an approved course

- on the installation of lawn sprinkler systems; and
- C) Proof that the course taken by the employees was successfully completed and that their continuing education is also being completed. (Section 2.5(a) and (f) of the Law)

#### **Providers of Lawn Sprinkler Design** and Installation Courses

- a) A college, university, trade school, vocational school, or association that has established a program providing a course of instruction in lawn sprinkler design and installation may submit a letter to the Department requesting approval of its program or course of instruction. (Section 2.5(f) of the Law)
- b) The letter shall be obtained by downloading the letter from the Department's website (http://www.idph.state.il.us/envhealth/ plumbing.htm).
- c) The letter shall be submitted to the Illinois Department of Public Health, 525 West Jefferson Street, 3rd Floor, Springfield, Illinois 62761.
- d) The request for approval shall include information on the curriculum offered by the program and the qualifications of the organization. The course shall consist of a minimum of 2 days of classroom education and an exam and shall include a provision for continuing education. (Section 2.5(f) of the Law) The curriculum offered by the program shall minimally consist of the following topics and the amount of time proposed to be devoted to each topic:
  - 1) Basic principles of irrigation systems;

- 2) Planning and designing an irrigation system, including estimating, installation, repair and maintenance;
- Alteration, extension and dismantling 3) of irrigation systems;
- Irrigation system components, 4) materials and equipment;
- Joints and connections; 5)
- Inspection and testing of an irrigation 6) system;
- Sciences of pneumatics and hydraulics 7) as they apply to irrigation systems;
- Plastics and thermoplastic materials 8) utilized in irrigation systems;
- Installation practices, including site 9) and worker safety;
- Use and care of tools and equipment; 10)
- 11) Source water for irrigation systems; and
- Electric controls and control systems 12) for irrigation systems.
- e) The Department shall evaluate the curriculum and organization before making a determination to approve or deny a request for approval. (Section 2.5(f) of the Law)

#### Inspection, Testing, and **Registration of Lawn Sprinkler Systems**

c) No person shall cause the installation of a lawn sprinkler system by attaching any fixture to any water source except from a public water system, as defined by Section 3.365 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, or

a water well, as defined by Section 3(e) of the Water Well Construction Code, without prior written approval from the Department. An irrigation contractor or licensed plumber may request written approval for using an alternative water source by providing a written request to the Department and by submitting written plans and specifications, sealed by an Illinois Registered Architect or Licensed Professional Engineer.

- All automatically operated lawn sprinkler systems shall have furnished and installed technology that inhibits or interrupts operation of the landscape irrigation system during periods of sufficient moisture or rainfall.
  - 1) The technology must be adjustable either by the end user or the irrigation contractor. This subsection (f) does not apply to systems operating on golf courses or agricultural lands.
  - 2) The requirements of this subsection (f) apply to all landscape irrigation systems installed after January 1, 2009. (Section 2.5(g) of the Law)

#### Fee Increases are as follows:

- Notice of cancellation of irrigation employee, \$20.
- Fee for inspection by a State inspector, \$500.
- Registration of each lawn sprinkler system, \$25.
- Irrigation contractors with 7 or fewer employees, \$400.
- The fee for a dishonored negotiable instrument including, but not limited to, returned checks or insufficient payment shall be \$200.

## CERTIFIED PLUMBING INSPECTOR EXAMS TO BE GIVEN

Revisions to the Illinois Plumbers Licensing Code that became effective on September 23rd require that all plumbing inspectors must be certified by the IDPH. Those that are directly employed by a municipality have until March 30, 2015 to obtain their certification. All others must currently have their certification in order to continue inspecting plumbing. You may download an application for the exam at the IDPH website: http://www.idph.state.il.us/envhealth/plumbing. htm. The exam will be given twice monthly at the following IDPH Regional Office locations:

## **UPDATES TO OSHA's** RECORDKEEPING RULE

OSHA's updated recordkeeping rule expands the list of severe injuries that all employers must report to OSHA. Employers must begin to comply with the new requirements on January 1, 2015.

#### What am I required to report under the new rule?

Previously, employers had to report the following to OSHA:

- All work-related fatalities
- Work-related hospitalizations of three or more employees Starting in 2015, employers will have to report the following to OSHA:
- All work-related fatalities
- All work-related inpatient hospitalizations of one or more employees
- All work-related amputations
- All work-related losses of an eye

#### Who is covered under the new rule?

All employers under OSHA jurisdiction must report all work-related fatalities, hospitalizations, amputations and losses of an eye to OSHA, even employers who are exempt from routinely keeping OSHA injury and illness records due to company size or industry.

### How soon must I report a fatality or severe injury or illness?

Employers must report work-related fatalities within 8 hours of finding out about them. Employers only have to report fatalities that occurred within 30 days of a work-related incident.

For any inpatient hospitalization, amputation, or eye loss employers must report the incident within 24 hours of learning about it. Employers only have to report an inpatient hospitalization, amputation or loss of an eye that occurs within 24 hours of a work-related incident.

#### How do I report an event to **OSHA?**

Employers have three options for reporting the event:

- By telephone to the nearest OSHA Area Office during normal business hours.
- By telephone to the 24-hour OSHA hotline at 1-800-321-OSHA (6742).
- OSHA has developed a new means of reporting events electronically, which is available at www.osha.gov/report.

### What information do I need to report?

For any fatality that occurs within 30 days of a work-related incident, employers must report the event within 8 hours of finding out about it.

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## IRS Announces 2015 STANDARD MILEAGE RATES

The Internal Revenue Service has issued the 2015 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes.

Beginning on January 1, 2015, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car, van, pickup or panel truck will be:

- 57.5 cents per mile for business miles driven, up from 56 cents in 2014
- 23 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes, down half a cent from 2014
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations

The standard mileage rate for business is based on an annual study of the fixed and variable costs of operating an automobile, including depreciation, insurance, repairs, tires, maintenance, gas and oil. The rate for medical and moving purposes is based on the variable costs, such as gas and oil. The charitable rate is set by law.

Taxpayers always have the option of claiming deductions based on the actual costs of using a vehicle rather than the standard mileage rates.

A taxpayer may not use the business standard mileage rate for a vehicle after claiming accelerated depreciation, including the Section 179 expense deduction, on that vehicle. Likewise, the standard rate is not available to fleet owners (more than four vehicles used simultaneously). Details on these and other special rules are in Revenue Procedure 2010-51, the instructions to Form 1040 and various online IRS publications including Publication 17, Your Federal Income Tax.

Besides the standard mileage rates, Notice 2014-79, posted on IRS.gov, also includes the basis reduction amounts for those choosing the business standard mileage rate, as well as the maximum standard automobile cost that may be used in computing an allowance under a fixed and variable rate plan.

# 2014 Legislative Accomplishments

- PASSED legislation preventing the subordination of mechanic's liens.
   Subordination is now prohibited as a condition of a loan contract or subcontract (SB 3023)
- PASSED legislation amending the Public Construction Bond Act to require sureties to meet certain qualifications including: bonds MUST have a certificate of authority from the Department of Insurance, the company must have a financial rating of at least an A- (HB 4769)
- STOPPED legislation that would allow a bond to take the place of YOUR mechanics liens (HB 4657)
- **STOPPED** legislation that would have REQUIRED a written and executed contract in order for you to file a mechanics lien (HB 5663)
- STOPPED legislation that would have allowed out of state contractors to enter Illinois during a state of emergency to provide disaster relief services WITHOUT meeting licensing requirements, or register, file or remit state and local taxes on disaster related work (HB 5595)
- AMENDED legislation that would have removed the 10 year "statute of repose" on liability of exposure to pollutants to *only asbestos* instead of <u>all pollutants</u> as originally written (SB 2221)




