#### **CHANGES TO PLUMBING LICENSE** RENEWALS RENEW NOW!



#### WHAT'S WRONG WITH THIS PICTURE?

First thoughts you may have as you are looking at this picture may be, "why would a licensed plumber install backflow devices on flexible supplies". Let us describe what you are looking at. This is the **backside** of a Grossing Table. A Grossing Table is used in a hospital lab to dissect and thinly



slice human tissue for biopsy. Other components of the table consist of garbage disposal, down draft fume hood, lineal table wash down, hand held strainer for sample washing, and two other water supply faucets. (Another grossing table will back up to this one.)

The table is set up so the operator, being tall or short, can raise (up to 8") or lower the height for personal comfort. Why the luxury? The operator generally spends 5 to 6 plus hours at a time working on samples which determine how a patient is treated.

The backflow devices are set up on the flex lines not only for equipment operation, but also for testing. The devices can be taken out the front of the table. tested over a bucket and repaired if needed, then replaced without being taken out of operation.

#### Section 890.1130 Protection of Potable Water /

- b) Approval of Devices and Maintenance. Backflow prevention assemblies shall be tested and approved by a Cross-Connection Control Device Inspector (CCCDI) before initial operation, and at least annually thereafter.
- c) Backflow. Where it is not possible to provide a minimum fixed air gap, the water outlet

shall be equipped with an accessible backflow prevention device or assembly in accordance with subsection (f) or Section 890.1140.

Although there were no aspirators installed on this unit. the State and Local plumbing inspectors concluded that RPZ's would provide

adequate protection since the code section listed below allows RPZ's for similar applications.

#### Section 890.1140 Special Applications and **Installations**

- h) Aspirators. Water operated aspirators shall meet the following specifications:
- 1) The water supply line shall be equipped with a shut-off valve.
- A) In operating rooms, emergency rooms, recovery rooms, delivery rooms, autopsy rooms, dental offices and laboratories where aspirators are installed for removing blood, pus and/or other fluids, a vacuum breaker shall be installed on the discharge side of the control valve, at ceiling height (a minimum of 7 feet, 6 inches); or a reduced pressure principle backflow preventer assembly shall be used.

The last item which needs to be addressed is an air gap between the RPZ's and the receptor. Manufactured air gap fittings were installed above an oversized receptor with trap primer. Air gap fittings provided are designed by each manufacturer to handle full flow discharge and can be included as part of the

assembly. This fitting allowed discharge outlets to be at the top of the receptor to 8" above the receptor. (Flexible drain materials were not considered, due to the chance of kinking during operation). Air gap fittings for RPZ's are of similar design as those used and approved for ASSE 1018 trap primers, therefore meeting the definition as listed in the plumbing code

#### **Section 890.120 Definitions**

"Air Gap": The unobstructed vertical distance through the free atmosphere between the lowest opening from any pipe or faucet supplying water to a tank or plumbing fixture and the flood-level rim of the receptacle. An air gap in a drainage system is a piping arrangement in which a drain from a fixture, appliance or device discharges indirectly into another fixture, receptacle, or interceptor at a point above the flood level rim. (See Appendix B: Illustrations A and B.)

#### Section 890.1040 Air Gaps

The air gap between an indirect waste and the drainage system shall be at least two (2) times the diameter of the fixture drain or drainage pipe served, but shall never be less than one (1) inch. For requirements in excess of this minimum, see Appendix A: Table C, and Appendix H: Illustration F.

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#### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

#### By BEV POTTS

The Spring Session of the Illinois General Assembly began in mid-January. We are currently monitoring and reviewing new legislation as it is introduced. There have been many bills introduced dealing with workers compensation, IEPA, procurement, unemployment, prevailing wage, public utilities, energy, MBE/FBE requirements, and other construction issues. Many of these bills are vehicle bills and will be combined, amended or eliminated. We will continue to monitor these issues and provide updates when the information is available. Following are just some of the bills we are watching and their current status.

#### **Plumbing/Piping/Trade Related Bills:**

- HB 4180 (M. Madigan) Makes a technical change to the Employee Washroom Act. Referred to House Rules.
- HB 4267 (L. Chapa LaVia) Amends the Illinois Plumbing License Law to provide that no governmental unit shall act as a plumbing contractor. Further provides that a person employed by a governmental unit as a Plumbing Inspector is prohibited from acting as a plumbing contractor on behalf of the governmental unit. Referred to House Rules.
- HB 5038 (J. Durkin) Makes a technical change in the Illinois Plumbing License. Referred to House Rules.
- HB 5410 (R. Gabel) Amends the Lead Poisoning Prevention Act. Prohibits persons from acting as lead abatement contractors, supervisors, and workers unless licensed accordingly by the Department. Sets forth criminal sanctions and civil penalties for violations of the Act.

Makes other changes. Assigned to House **Human Services** 

- HB 5735 (A. Williams) Creates the Home Repair and Construction Task Force Act. Provides that the Task Force shall: (1) discuss whether the residents of Illinois would benefit from legislation requiring home repair and construction service providers to obtain a license from the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation before offering theses services in Illinois; (2) if it is determined that licensure is required, determine the requirements applicants must meet to qualify for a license, grounds for denial or revocation of a license, and any other considerations relevant to a licensing requirement; and (3) make recommendations to the General Assembly. Provides that the Task Force shall report to the General Assembly no later than November 1, 2015. Repeals the Act on January 1, 2016. Assigned to House Business & Occupational Licenses Committee.
- **HB 5776 (T. Demmer)** Amends the Higher Education Green Jobs and Technology Act. Permits public community colleges to establish green jobs certificate programs for workers in certain industries, including the energy efficient building industry, construction and retrofitting, and others. Assigned to the House Higher Education.
- SB 3215 (J. Morrison) Makes a technical change in the Illinois Plumbing License. Referred to Senate Assignments.
- SB 3047 (D. Kotowski) Creates the Water Loss Accounting Awareness Act. Provides that,

before July 31, 2015, the Illinois EPA, in consultation with the Department of Natural Resources, the Illinois Commerce Commission, the Illinois State Water Survey of the University of Illinois, and other local and regional water management leaders and interested parties, shall submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report that reviews and evaluates the latest available information on water loss in Illinois including existing data, policies, procedures, and institutional knowledge (including reports from the federal Environmental Protection Agency, the American Water Works Association, and the State archives). Assigned to the Senate **Environment Committee.** 

SB 3055 (D. Biss) Amends the Illinois Water Well Construction Code. Changes the definitions of "modification" and "closed loop well". Makes other changes. Assigned to Senate Public Health Committee

#### **Other Construction/Business Related Bills:**

HB 4657 (A. Turner) Amends the Mechanics Lien Act. Provides that an applicant may file a petition to substitute a bond for the property subject to a lien claim on the property against which the lien claim is asserted. "Bonding Over" would seriously weaken the mechanics lien rights of contractors, subcontractors, laborers and material suppliers that the construction industry has fought hard to secure. Often times, the only leverage available to a contractor who is owed money for work performed is to record a mechanics lien against a project. Without a mechanics lien on the property, contractors and subcontractors

are compelled to either accept a significantly smaller payment for their work, or endure expensive and lengthy litigation. IMSCA and the Illinois PHCC strongly oppose this bill. Referred to House Rules

HB 4769 (D. Beiser) This bill is an initiative of IMSCA and amends the Public Construction Bond Act to provide that the surety on a bond shall be a company with a certificate of authority from the Department of Insurance specifically authorizing it to execute surety bonds and a financial strength rating of at least A as rated by A.M. Best or a similar rating agency. Assigned to State Government Administration Committee.

HB 5663 (E. Simms, Jr.) Amends the Mechanics Lien Act to provide that the Act does not apply unless there is a written and executed contract to improve the lot or tract of land or for the purpose of improving the tract of land or to manage a structure under construction thereon. This proposal would require a written and executed contract before a subcontractor could have lien rights. IMSCA and the Illinois PHCC are in opposition of this proposal. Assigned to House Judiciary Committee.

SB 3023 (J. Mulroe) This bill is an IMSCA initiative seeking to amend the Mechanics Lien Act to prevent the elimination of lien rights through the use of subordination clauses. Assigned to the Senate Judiciary Committee.

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

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#### Listen Up!

How can you tell if you're losing your hearing? You probably can't. Hearing loss is an insidious process that creeps up on you with little or no warning. As sound reception becomes fainter, you may try to compensate without even realizing it by turning the TV or radio up louder, by asking others to repeat themselves, or even by leaning closer to the source.

Prolonged exposure to loud noises on and off the job accumulates over years and can eventually cause permanent hearing impairment or deafness. By the time you realize you have a problem, the condition is very likely irreversible.

Don't wait until it is too late. Start wearing your hearing protection devices right away. You are ultimately responsible for consistent and proper use of your protective equipment.

#### **Arguments and Answers**

I know some of you have concerns and difficulties about wearing your hearing protections, so let's review some of them.

You are used to the noise and it doesn't bother you. This may be true, but exposure to noise does not "toughen up" your ears. The reason it doesn't bother you may be because you have already begun to lose your hearing.

If you've already lost some hearing, why wear the protectors now? Just because you've lost some of your hearing doesn't mean you can't lose more or all of it. Early hearing loss is concentrated in the higher frequencies. As it progresses, it spreads to the lower frequencies and affects comprehension of normal speech. Although protection devices cannot

restore a noise-induced hearing loss, they can prevent additional losses.

- Your machine sounds different with the protectors on. Yes, it does sound different, and over time you will adjust to the differences and be able to monitor the sounds effectively.
- With hearing protection you can't hear your co-workers. Without protectors, the high noise level causes overload for your hearing. Reducing overall sound levels allows the ear to operate more effectively. just as sunglasses provide improved vision in high glare conditions, although it may take a little getting used to. Then you should be able to hear whatever you need to.
- Why do the protectors have to be so uncomfortable? They shouldn't be, although like new shoes or glasses, they do need a period of adjustment. If the discomfort persists, it could be a sizing problem or you may need a different type of protector. Let someone know and work together to find the right device for you.

To make sure that we all do our part in hearing conservation, it is important that we receive cooperation from everyone. Besides openly discussing your concerns, you can make a difference by doing the following:

Follow all precautions, procedures, and practices for your machinery and your hearing devices to minimize excessive exposure to noise.



- Watch for warning signs that are posted in areas where high noise levels exist and make sure you wear your protectors in those areas.
- Let someone know of any operation or condition that presents a noise hazard that they may be unaware of.
- It doesn't help to follow hearing precautions at work if you are exposed to high noise levels at home. Make sure you minimize noise exposure in all aspects of your life. Protect your children's hearing, too, by explaining the dangers of blasting rock music—and set an example for them.

Above all, wear your hearing protection regularly. It does work.

#### **Hearing Protection Do's and Don'ts Checklist**

	Make sure not to skip hearing test appointments.
	Help maintain machinery to reduce noise levels.
	Be aware of noise levels requiring hearing protection.
	Have your hearing tested if you have:
	—noise or ringing in your ears
	—trouble hearing people speaking
	—trouble hearing certain high or soft sounds
	—TV or radio volume turned so high others complain.
	Wear assigned hearing protectors.
	Report hearing protectors that don't fit well or are in poor condition.
	Make sure hands are clean before inserting or putting on hearing protectors.
	Keep hearing protectors clean.
	Use hearing protectors in loud-noise activities off the job.

	Tamper with hearing-testing or noise-reduction equipment.
	Ignore or "forget" to use hearing protection.
	Use hearing protectors that are loose or cracked.
	Use hearing protectors that don't fit snugly over or into the ear.

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
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#### National Severe Weather Preparedness Week


